### Contact Your Child's Health Care Provider/Medical Home

- · Talk about your child's needs
- Ask for referrals for needed <u>therapies</u> like OT, PT, SLP, & <u>Applied Behavior</u> Analysis (ABA)



#### Review Insurance Needs

- Call your health insurance to ask about coverage for services the health care provider/ medical home has recommended.
- Consider Medicaid: <u>Dr Dynasaur</u> or <u>Disabled Children's Home Care</u>



# Is Your Child Birth to Age Five?

- Connect with <u>Children's Integrated</u>
   <u>Services</u> for referrals to appropriate
   services like service coordination,
   therapies and parenting support
- Learn about <u>Early Childhood & Family</u>
  <u>Mental Health Services</u>



## Is Your Child School-Aged?

- Your child may qualify for an <u>IEP</u> or Section 504
- <u>Request</u> a comprehensive evaluation from your <u>school district</u>
- Work with the school team to develop appropriate services



### Call Your Designated Agency

- Ask what services your child and family might qualify for now
- Inquire about a <u>Children's Personal Care</u> <u>Services</u> assessment
- Ask about <u>Family Managed Respite</u>
  & <u>Flexible Family Funding</u>
