Browser and device types

- The [Immunization Registry Page](https://healthvermont.gov/stats/registries/immunization-registry) (healthvermont.gov/stats/registries/immunization-registry) is the location of the login link to the Registry (and the test app), both only supported on the Microsoft Edge, Mozilla Firefox and Google Chrome browsers. The logins are incompatible with Internet Explorer, Safari, Opera, and any other web browsers and will not open if clicked.
- If you click the link above and the webpage opens in an unsupported browser, you will need to either change your default browser through your computer's settings or you can copy and paste the link into a supported browser.
- The app is not supported on mobile devices.

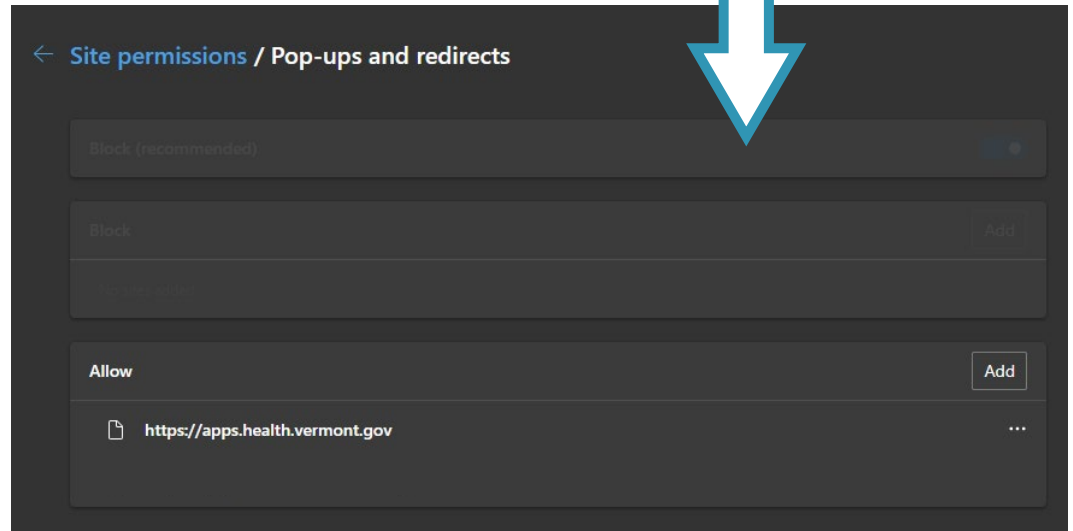
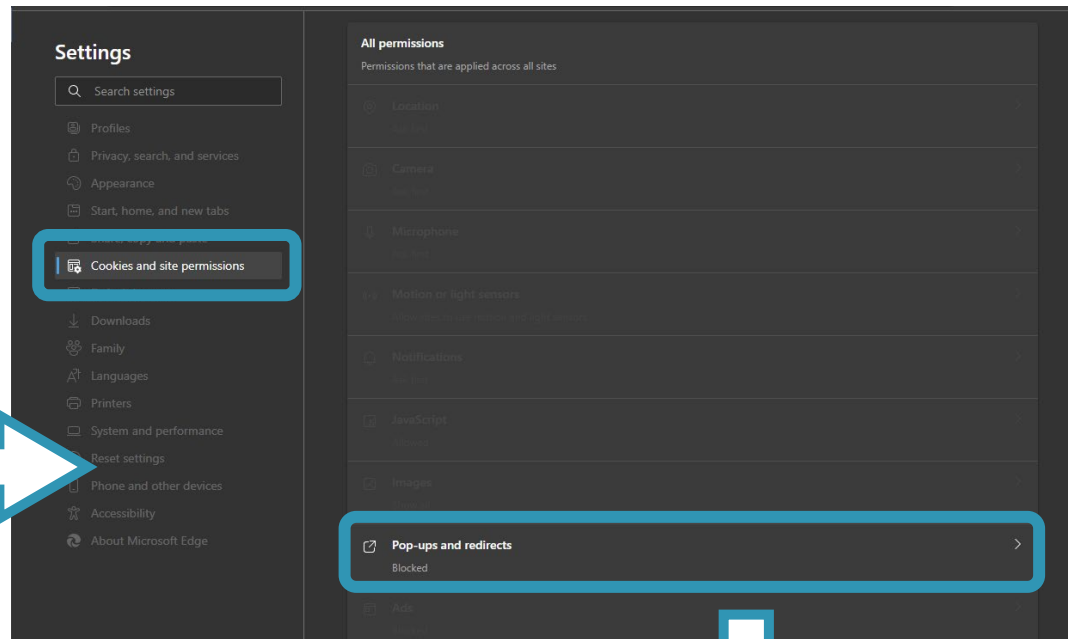
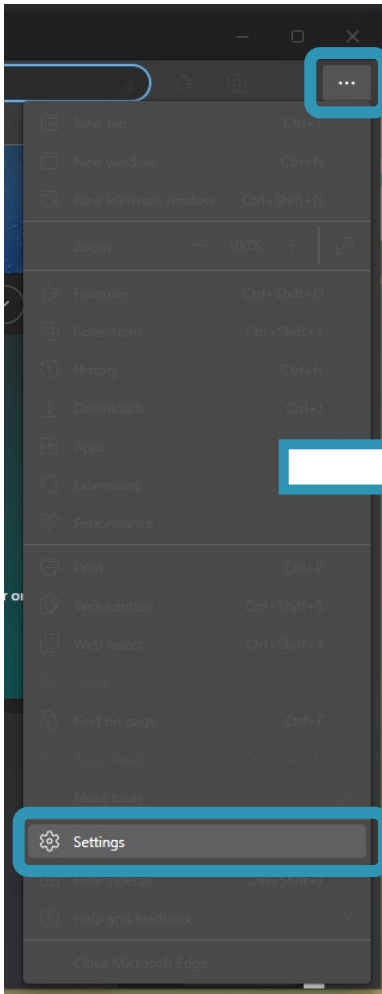
Popup Blocking

If the app is not loading in the correct browser, there is a chance it is being interrupted by the default pop-up blocker. This setting can also affect whether reports will fully load for some users. To solve this, you will need to copy the url for the application (below) and paste it into the pop-up whitelist in the browser settings.

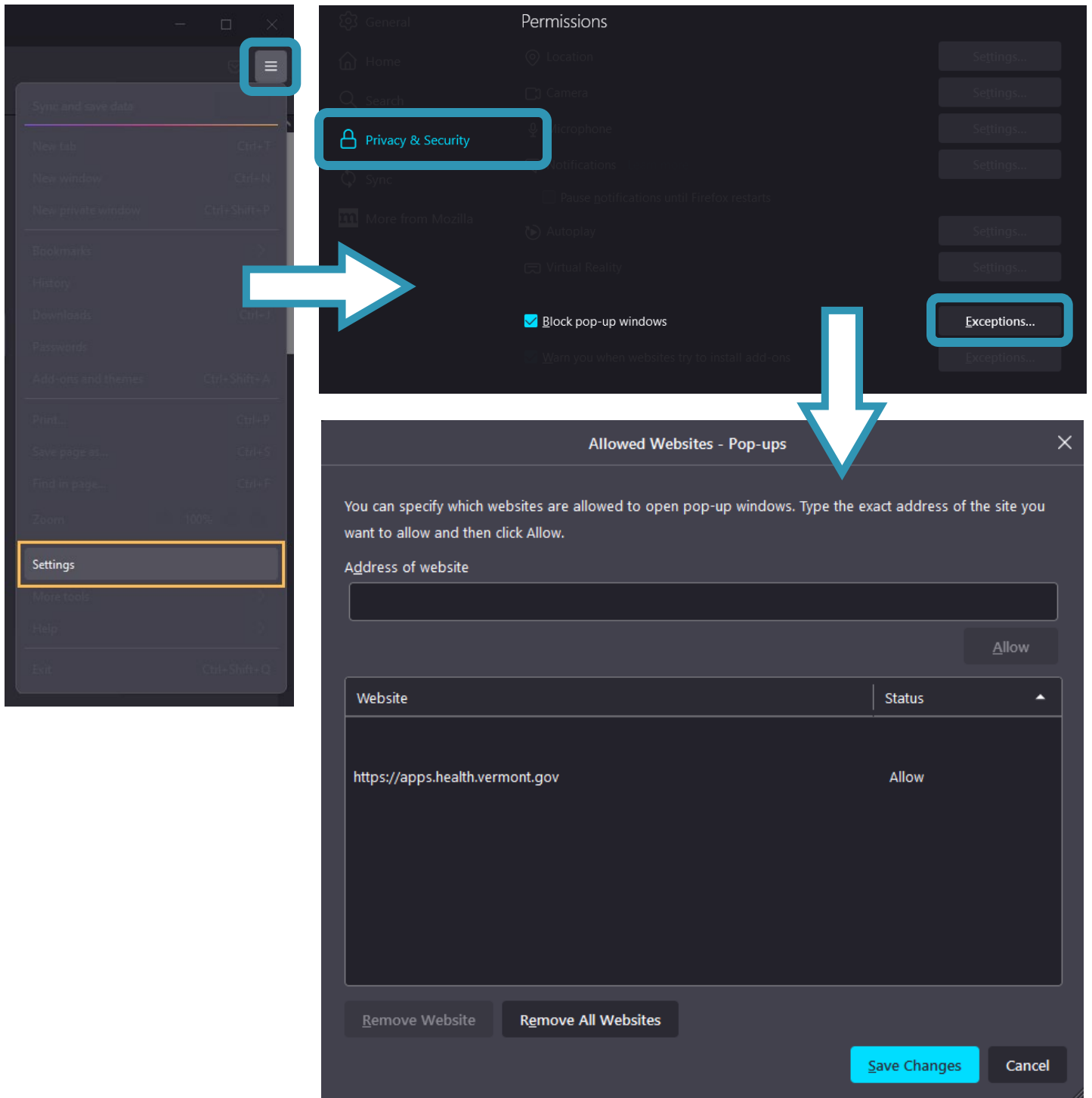
