

When Do Adults Need Vaccinations?

Vermont Recommended Adult Immunization Schedule

Age 19-49	Td / Tdap	Td 1 dose every 10 years Substitute 1 dose of Tdap for Td for age <65 Tdap is strongly recommended for those individuals that will be in contact with infants. The interval between the last Td and Tdap can be < 5 years if there is contact with an infant.
	Pneumococcal	1 dose if high risk 2nd dose in 5 years? if immunocompromised no more than 2 doses are needed in a lifetime.
	Influenza	1 dose annually for all adults
	Hepatitis B	3 doses if at risk for Hepatitis B
	Hepatitis A	2 doses if at risk for Hepatitis A (3 doses if given as combined Hep A/B vaccine.
	HPV	3 doses for women age < 26

Age 50-64	Td / Tdap	Td 1 dose every 10 years Substitute 1 dose of Tdap for Td for age <65 Tdap is strongly recommended for those individuals that will be in contact with infants. The interval between the last Td and Tdap can be < 5 years if there is contact with an infant.
	Pneumococcal	1 dose if high risk 2nd dose in 5 years? if immunocompromised no more than 2 doses are needed in a lifetime.
	Influenza	1 dose annually for all adults
	Hepatitis B	3 doses if at risk for Hepatitis B
	Hepatitis A	2 doses if at risk for Hepatitis A (3 doses if given as combined Hep A/B vaccine.
	Zoster	1 dose after age 60

Age 65+	Td / Tdap	Td 1 dose every 10 years
	Pneumococcal	1 dose 2nd dose? if vaccinated before 65 and has been more than 5 years.
	Influenza	1 dose annually for all adults
	Hepatitis B	3 doses if at risk for Hepatitis B
	Hepatitis A	2 doses if at risk for Hepatitis A (3 doses if given as combined Hep A/B vaccine.
	Zoster	1 dose after age 60

Vaccine for Special Circumstances

MMR - 2 doses if not immune (not to be given if pregnant or HIV+)

Varicella - 2 doses if not immune (not to be given if pregnant or HIV+)

Haemophilus Influenzae - 1 dose for people with leukemia, HIV, sickle cell and/or without a spleen.

Meningococcal - First year college students living in dorms, people without a spleen or for travel.
