



 4. One site is a mobile dental clinic.


Provider needs

- This map only shows ratios of Physicians, not PAs or NPs.
- 67 FTEs:100,000 population is considered 'adequate'.
- 1:3,500 for geographic HPSA; no RSAs meet this threshold.
- This map starts to help us target VT resources for PC workforce and health center sites.



Rural Health Gaps

- This map shows only Vermont hospitals, not those located nearby in NH, NY or MA.
- It gives some indication of gaps in health care services.
- With the help of regional AHEC offices, our next map will show drive times to all primary care practices in VT.
