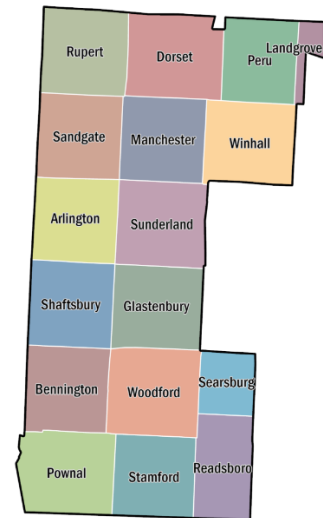


Office of Local Health in Bennington County 2025

Provides supplemental foods, nutrition education, breastfeeding support and promotion, to pregnant and post-partum people and children under 5.
