Substance Use in Shelter

- 80% of Guests were actively using substances
- All guests were either using substances or in various stage of recovery from SUD
- Three non-fatal overdoses
- Substances regularly consumed:
 - Opiates
 - Stimulants
 - Alcohol
- Wound care needs

Medical Services in Shelter

- Community Health Center medical outreach in three low-barrier shelters between January – March 2024
- Most common issues were:
 - SUD
 - Wounds: Non-healing, wounds, abscess, infection dressing supplies
 - Dental pain
 - Foot issues
- Total patient visits: 437
- Services provided:
 - Chronic issues: 157
 - Acute issues: 144
 - Psych issues: 19
 - SUD counseling: 14
 - ER referral: 11 (3 followed-up)
 - PCP referral: 56 (17 followed-up)
