Who We Work With

We reach high-risk people with complex needs

Intake Data:

F

- 283 unique clients since August 2022
- 64% were recently released from incarceration
- 90% were unhoused or insecurely housed
- 81% tested positive for both stimulants and opioids
- 80% reported current injection drug use
- 99.4% reported extremely low or very low income (based on HUD income guidelines)

We reach high-risk people with complex needs

Intake Data:

- 86% reported a history of serious wounds, blood infections or endocarditis
- 34% had current wounds or infections (likely due to Xylazine contamination)
- 57% experienced serious mental health symptoms related to methamphetamine use
- 94% reported a history of overdose
- 54% of participants had overdosed in the last 6 months

Request: Outreach Position for Chittenden & Addison Counties

- Please consider recommending assignment of one outreach position to VCJR for deployment in Chittenden and Addison Counties
- 26 outreach/case management positions <u>currently part of ongoing funding</u> (one or more of these positions are reportedly currently going unused)
- Opportunity to make sure already allocated funds are fully and optimally utilized
- VCJR is well positioned to make very good use of one of these unused positions
- Will significantly improve the outreach capacity of our small organization –an organization with a proven track record of success in reaching high-risk individuals otherwise not connected to care

Expanding our Outreach Capacity

- Build on our proven ability to reach those at highest risk and engage in services
- Expand capacity to find people in the community and link to treatment and services
- Regularly connect and collaborate with other community providers and street outreach services
- Expand efforts to reconnect with high-risk people lost to contact and re-engage in services
- We are a small staff and could greatly expand our outreach capacity with an additional staff member focused specifically on outreach

Community Benefits

- Prevent overdose deaths
- Reduce unnecessary incarceration
- Keep parents and children together
- Reduce crime
- Reduce interpersonal violence
- Reduce health disparities and improve health outcomes
- Increase community connection during the high-risk period following incarceration
- Long standing and trusted relationships with justice involved people provides realistic opportunities for people to get support before things reach a point of desperation and reduces likelihood of violence and crime

Some of our direct supports and services

- Walk-in case management that is not dependent on recovery status
 - Clients drop in daily with serious medical and treatment needs
- Treatment options counseling, referral and linkages to care
- Transportation from the correctional facility, to inpatient treatment, to medical appointments, etc.
- Support in filling critical gaps in care in the moment of need (MOUD, housing, basic needs)
- Medical clinic and medical case management
- Crisis support and referral
- Systems advocacy
- Accompaniment and visits to the emergency room and hospital, post hospital discharge planning and support
- Parenting and DCF support

Overdose Prevention Services

- Naloxone distribution and training
- Fentanyl and Xylazine test strip distribution and education
- Harm reduction education
- Drug treatment options counseling and referral
- Picking people up directly from the facility upon release
- Address gaps to medication during a very high-risk time
- Overdose prevention focused contingency management
- Drug checking clinic (in collaboration with Vermont CARES)
- Low barrier and on demand access to MOUD
- Treatment coordination and treatment retention support
