## Co-Occurring Recovery Campus - RFI Q & A

1. What are the minimum requirements to meet the on-site physical health care screening? Would SMART requirements be sufficient?

The State is interested in hearing from respondents what physical health screenings and referral pathways would be appropriate for the respondent's anticipated population to be served on the Recovery Campus and the staffing needs associated with the work.

2. Is the expected requirements to have medical personnel onsite 24/7 or during day working hours or less?

No, the physical health screening and referral services does not require 24/7 medical personnel onsite.

3. What are the minimum accepted licensures for medical personnel?

The State is interested in hearing from respondents anticipated physical health screenings and referral staffing needs. The State expects all staff are working within their scope of practice.

4. Would an LPN on-site (daytime hours) with NP assessment on admission and minimum weekly review be appropriate, with med delegated staff onsite 24/7? NP or MD would be on call for staff 24/7.

The State is interested in hearing from respondents the anticipated physical health screenings and referral staffing needs. The State does not expect that the above-described staffing pattern would be necessary.

5. Is there a minimum/maximum proposed grant budget for facilities development?

There is not an established minimum/maximum proposed grant budget for facilities development/start-up/physical space siting and construction. It will be a one-time allowable cost.

6. How many sites is DSU interested in exploring?

The State is exploring the possibility of funding one campus.

7. Is there a geographic preference for where the site(s) will be located?

The State is interested in hearing from respondents their anticipated campus location and their awareness of necessary community partners and available workforce.
