Refresher: What are we working towards?

To meet the requirements set forth by the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) and state regulation, The Health Department is working with you achieve the following goals over the next few years:

Formalize requirements for **individuals** delivering Recovery Support Services and the **organizations** that employ these individuals to help ensure a high standard of service for those in recovery.

Build a foundation for Medicaid reimbursement by ensuring that **Recovery Center operations** can accommodate Medicaid requirements.

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Design and roll out a **Medicaid benefit model that is efficient** while adhering to minimum Medicaid requirements.

2024 Accomplishments and Next Steps (1 of 2)



Peer Recovery Support Specialist (PRSS) Certification

Certification of PRSS via the Office of Professional Regulation (OPR) using the existing Recovery Coach certification requirements.

2024 Accomplishments

- Development and passage of **OPR Legislation (Act 170)** to establish OPR as the authority for certifying PRSS
- Drafting and ongoing processing of the certification rule and revised Code of Ethics

Next Steps

- Continue formal rule processing through Spring 2025
- Procure an organization to provide PRSS training by Spring 2025
- **Operationalize** PRSS certification (e.g, training, credentialing, and certification process) by June 2025



Recovery Services Organization (RSO) Certification

Certification of RSOs (e.g., Recovery Centers) to build upon existing work and accredit organizations who maintain a high standard of service.

2024 Accomplishments

- Drafting and ongoing processing the certification rule with your input
- Finalization of the draft **standards** and **assessment tool** for certification with your input

Next Steps

- Continue formal **rule processing** through early 2025
- **Develop** certification processes and procedures (e.g., site visits) *in early 2025*
- Engage with you to prepare for the process in Spring/Summer 2025

Foundation Building Exercises

Exercises to learn more about Recovery Center operations and areas of support needed for upcoming certifications and Medicaid.

Next Steps

- Analyze data submitted for the **Time Study Exercise**, distribute the results to you, and reflect on the findings during the in-person kickoff meeting *in January* 2025
- Plan for upcoming **foundational visits** to hear more from you about your operations and needs *in the first half of* 2025

Medicaid Benefit Design & Roll-Out

Design and implementation of **RSS as a Medicaid benefit** and other adjustments necessary to support Medicaid reimbursement of RSS.

2024 Accomplishments

- Internal review of minimum federal requirements for Medicaid benefit design and delivery of services
- Peer state research to learn more about RSS benefit models

Next Steps

- Refine the **benefit model** to meet minimum Medicaid requirements *through 2025*
- Implement IT updates/tools for Medicaid compliance through 2025
