Changes to WIC Infant Foods

Effective January 1, 2025

The USDA made changes to infant foods-reducing the amount of infant cereal and infant meats and increasing the amount of Cash Value Benefit (CVB) for fruits and vegetables.




Formula Fed Infants

Infant Cereal 8 ounces

Infant Fruits and Vegetables 128 ounces or 32 jars


Fully Breastfed Infants



As of January 1, 2025, families with infants over 6 months can trade jarred baby food fruits and vegetables for \$11 (half) or \$22 (all) Cash Value Benefit (CVB).

(4 oz/jar)

The CVB can be used to purchase fresh, frozen, or canned fruits and vegetables. You can make this change at your WIC appointment or by contacting <u>your local WIC office</u>.
