# **Updates to Vermont's Reportable Diseases Rule**

## Summary

Vermont's <u>Reportable and Communicable Diseases Rule</u> has been updated effective August 10, 2024.

## **Requested Actions**

Review the updated rule and report to the Health Department as required. Epidemiologists are available 24/7 at 802-863-7240 option 2.

## **Key Updates to the Rule**

- 1. The updated rule changes the **required reporting period for positive SARS-CoV-2 results and COVID-19** from "immediately" to "within 24 hours."
- 2. The following diseases have been added to the list of reportable diseases/laboratory findings in humans:
  - a. COVID-19-related pediatric deaths
  - b. Mpox (human monkeypox)
  - c. Blastomycosis
  - d. Infant botulism
  - e. Salmonella Paratyphi
  - f. Positive Tuberculin skin test (TST) results
  - g. Non-detectable Hepatitis C nucleic acid results
  - h. Hepatitis C genotype results
  - i. Specific arboviral illnesses:
    - i. Chikungunya virus disease
    - ii. La Crosse virus disease
    - iii. St. Louis encephalitis
- 3. The following diseases have been removed from the list of reportable diseases/laboratory findings in humans:

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- a. Arboviruses (unspecified)
- b. Negative and indeterminate SARS-CoV-2 results
- c. Guillain-Barré Syndrome
- d. Viral hemorrhagic fever
- 4. The following diseases have been added to the list of specimens or isolates from humans that shall be sent to the Health Department Laboratory:
  - a. Bacillus anthracis
  - b. Bacillus cereus, biovar anthracis
  - c. Cryptosporidium species
  - d. La Crosse virus
  - e. Legionella species
  - f. Ricin toxin
  - g. St. Louis encephalitis virus
  - h. Streptococcus pyogenes (group A), isolated from a normally sterile site
  - i. Vibrio species
  - i. Yersinia enterocolitica
- 5. The following diseases have been added to the list of reportable diseases/laboratory findings in animals:
  - a. Mpox
  - b. SARS-CoV-2 infection
- 6. The following diseases have been removed from the from the list of reportable diseases/laboratory findings in animals:
  - a. Bovine spongiform encephalopathy
  - b. Melioidosis
  - c. Ricin toxin
  - d. Viral hemorrhagic fever
- 7. Additional relevant clinical and laboratory information shall now be reported if requested by the Health Department.
- 8. Susceptibility results shall now be reported for these laboratory findings:
  - a. Haemophilus influenzae, isolated from a normally sterile site
  - b. Mycobacterium tuberculosis complex
  - c. Neisseria meningitidis, isolated from a normally sterile site

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9. The rule was also reorganized for clarity, including added tables that align the reportable diseases with their associated laboratory findings.

**Info Service Message:** Provides general correspondence from the Vermont Department of Health, which is not necessarily considered to be of an emergent nature.

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
